

Historic Perryburg's Third Annual Gingerbread House Contest

Theme of Contest - Your artistic interpretation of a home, business or church located in the historic district of Perryburg or create an entry of your own design. Purchased kits may be used.

Date of Contest – December 6 – December 21, 2013.

General Rules & Information

1. The contest is open to individuals, children, families, youth groups and businesses.
2. One entry only per person or group. One registration form per entry.
3. Registration is required by Friday, November 29, 2013.
4. All contestants must sign a release allowing the Historic Perryburg and the Way Library to use their name, likeness and entry in the newsletter and website of same.
5. Entries must be delivered to the Way Library no later than 7 p.m. Friday, December 6, 2013. Please bring your registration confirmation. All entries will be exhibited from December 6, through December 21, 2013.
6. Decisions of the judges are final. Entries will be judged on creativity, neatness, and variety of material/details, use of color, setting, durability, and overall effect. Prizes will be awarded in all categories.
7. An Awards Ceremony will be held on Saturday, December 21 at 1:00 p.m.
8. Entries must be picked on December 20 before library closing. Any entries remaining thereafter will be discarded. Historic Perryburg and the Way Library do not assume responsibility for damage or loss.

Categories

- **Individual/Group/Family** – For children 14 and younger who work as a group or have adult assistance on **any** aspect of the entry. Maximum of 3 people working on an entry.
- **Adult Non-Professional** – Individual or group (1-3 persons max.) ages 15 and older who are **not** professional chefs, working in the culinary arts or are students of the culinary arts.
- **Adult Professional** – Individual or group (1-3 persons max.) ages 15 and older who **are** professional chefs, working in the culinary arts or are students of the culinary arts.

Guidelines

- Bases cannot exceed 19x 14 inches.
- All building materials except base should be edible.
